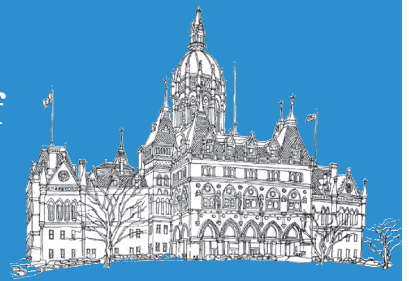

Invest in programs that promote cultural competency for all educators.

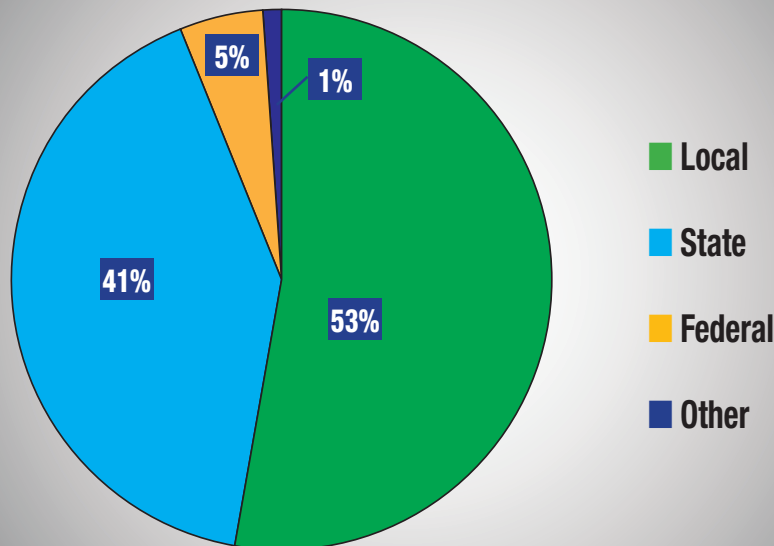


*CABE Mission Statement:
